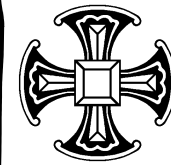

AN UPDATE ON WHO

Well, the English Major in me wants to correct that title to “whom,” but it’s actually an acronym I use to remember our Mission Statement: Worship, Hospitality, and Outreach. And I want to take a minute to give you an update on those three things . . .

WORSHIP: If you’ve been in church since June, you know we’ve started using just an outline of the service and relying more fully on the Book of Common Prayer. The word “Common” in that name means “collective,” rather than “ordinary.” (It is, in fact, an extraordinary book!) There are lots of good reasons for this change, not least of which is that it allows you to see that I am following the Canons by sticking to the rubrics and instructions. But this change also allows us too use substantially less paper, saving money and trees. One downside of relying more fully on the book is that it can be confusing for visitors. Which leads us to . . .

HOSPITALITY: St. Timothy’s has a long history of welcoming visitors and guests, both for worship and for our various events throughout the year. A tangible way to welcome folks to worship is to look for those who might be struggling with navigating the BCP on Sunday morning. If you see someone who looks baffled by the book—whether a visitor or a member of the parish—scoot on over and offer a little guidance. It’s not severely challenging to follow the service, but it can be intimidating.

OUTREACH: I didn’t have a smooth segue into this, so I’ll just jump right in. Here at St. Timothy’s, we have a long and creative history of reaching out to our neighbors, both locally and further afield. In addition to our annual efforts like collecting school supplies, providing holiday meals, gathering blankets in the fall, and so on, this year we are going to try our hand at a small Summer Festival. Basically, we just want to invite the neighbors over for some food and fun in the parking lot and on the lawn. We’re still in the planning stages of the event, and I’m hoping it’s something we can do each summer going forward. Please plan to attend this party after church on **August 19th**, and if you’re interested and able to help out, please contact Ann Higgins or me as soon as possible.

And there’s your WHO update. Hope you’re having a great summer!
