In the Book of Revelation, Jesus says, "I am the alpha and omega, the beginning and the end." Three times, in fact. We usually think of the beginning and the end as being opposites, or having opposing qualities. Something is *either* the beginning, or it is the end. (Although, sometimes we do say that something is the beginning of the end: the home opener for the Browns, comes to mind.)

As we move through the months of May and June, all sorts of things are beginning and ending. The school year finishes up, as summer begins. Students graduate, and also commence. Baseball begins, basketball and hockey end. The season of Pentecost begins, as the Easter season ends. In some ways, spring is a good reminder that nothing ends without something else beginning. (The Resurrection of Jesus comes to mind, right?)

And within these next two months, we will begin *and* end our Capital Campaign, "Growing with God." During May and June, every member of the parish will be contacted in person, and asked to support the future of St. Timothy's. A quick walk through our building reveals much of what needs to be done, the result of water damage and basic wear and tear. In addition, there are things that could use an upgrade, like our inaccessible bathrooms and lumpy pew cushions. And then there are the improvements, like an outdoor patio off the Parish Hall for resting in good weather, and a Columbarium as a final resting place.

I hope you will prayerfully consider supporting this Capital Campaign. St. Timothy's is your church home, and it needs some love and care, just as your family's home does. The committee has invested a lot of time and energy identifying the most cost-effective repairs and upgrades, and we welcome your input as we continue Growing with God.

As we begin this campaign, let us remember our ends: to Worship, offer Hospitality, and perform Outreach. That is why we are here, and why we continue to be St. Timothy's Episcopal Church. And along the way, we remain firmly in the grip of the One who is the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. May we continue Growing with God.

FELLOWSHIP ACTIVITIES

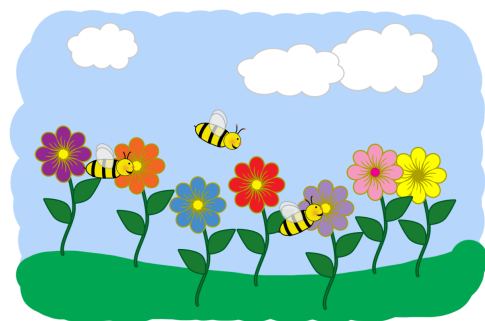
