

Hello September!

There is change afoot here at St. Timothy's as we head toward the fall. Most notably, starting September 10th, we'll be moving the second Sunday service forward to 10:30 rather than 10am. "Why's that," you ask? Thanks for asking. Two main reasons . . .

- 1. Since we currently have no parish-wide discipleship, formation, or Bible Study program at St. Timothy's, it seems like we ought to get something going, and adding a little extra time between services seems the best way to do that.
- 2. Having this Christian Education time between the services will hopefully encourage our two groups of worshippers to spend a little more time together. I am often surprised that folks don't necessarily know one another from the 8 and 10... er, I mean 10:30 services. (My surprise comes from the fact that I am usually at both services, of course.)

For now, we don't really have a plan for a children's program between the services, but I'm hoping we'll get that added before too long. In the meantime, I encourage you to plan to spend 9:15-10am with your fellow parishioners, getting to know one another, and exploring what it means for us to follow Jesus together.

On September 10th, we will spend that Christian Education time (9:15-10am) having a Ministry Fair. "What's a Ministry Fair," you ask? Thanks for asking. Basically, we will have information sign-up sheets in the Parish Hall about the various ministry opportunities here at St. Tim's. It will be a great chance to explore what is going on and how you can be part of keeping our parish moving in the direction you'd like to see us go.

Also on September 10^{th,} St. Timothy's Choir will once again begin singing at the 10:30 service. We're still searching for a Choir Director, and we hope to fill that position before long. Meanwhile, if you're interested in singing with the Choir, please let me or Organist Jay Spencer know. I have great expectations for rebuilding this important ministry at St. Tim's, and hope to see more smiling faces in the chancel.

So, to recap, starting September 10th, the later service moves to 10:30. At 9:15 that day, we'll have our Ministry Fair, and on the 17th at 9:15 we'll begin our Christian Education program. Looking forward to a second year of ministry alongside all of you!


