Altar Guild 101

People often ask me why we use red as the color for St. Timothy's Day here at St. Timothy's Church. And, well, it's not a very happy answer. But first, let me explain a bit about the colors of the Church in general.

As Thomas Merton points out, the best way to think about our liturgical colors is to remember that white contains all the other colors. And then when light is refracted, and spread out, we get all the other colors used in the church year. We use white at Easter and Christmas precisely because it contains all the other colors. We also use white at weddings, baptisms, and funerals.

So, green is the color of what we call "ordinary time." These are the seasons after Epiphany (like right now) and after Pentecost (during the summer). We use violet (the color of penitence) during Lent. Some church traditions also use violet during Advent, because that is a penitential season, but we Anglicans tend to use blue (which may or may not have a connection to the pre-Reformation Sarum Rite, which is a story for another time).

And that leaves red. We use the color red on Pentecost and at Ordinations, because red is the color of the Holy Spirit. But we *also* use red on days when we are observing a saint who was killed for their faith. And that list is w-a-y longer than it should be. Red is the color for most of the disciples of Jesus, and most of the saints you've heard of, including our patron saint, Timothy.

The received tradition says that Timothy was killed with stones and clubs for refusing to partake in a pagan celebration. (That's why his shield has a club and stones on it.) And so, we use red on St. Timothy Sunday, because he was martyred for his faith. As I said, it's not a very happy answer.

And though the color red reminds us of Timothy's murder because of his commitment to the faith, we need not be afraid. I want to remind you of Paul's advice to Timothy: For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind ~ 2 Timothy 1:7

May God continue to bless our parish, and may St. Timothy pray for us all, now and in the hour of death.

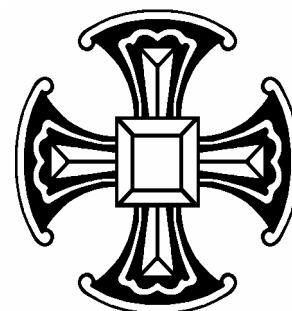

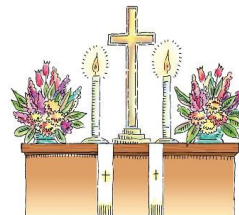
