(To paraphrase JFK, Ask not what your seminarian can do for you; ask what you can do for your seminarian.) I know that you will welcome Maureen warmly, and I thank you in advance for all the help and guidance you will give.

On September 9th, between the two services, we will have an informal sort of meet and greet, starting around 9:15am, where you'll have the chance to meet Maureen and find out more about her. On that Sunday, we'll also be kicking off our Mission Fair, which is a chance for all of us to learn more about the many programs and ministries here at St. Tim's, and to consider where God might be calling each of us to help out. I hope you can join us that Sunday.

As a follow up on the Growing with God campaign, I once again want to thank all those who helped make it a success, by serving on committees, and/or making a pledge. We're excited to begin work on the actual projects. If you're interested in helping out with getting those projects going, please let me know. We need a few more folks to get things started and to keep them on track.

I'm looking forward to the programs we've got planned, and the cooler weather that is (hopefully) coming, and for Maureen to get to know you all . . . and also for the chance to wear the lovely blue chasuble again! One closing thought, speaking of fieldwork . . . Both of the priests I worked with in my three years of fieldwork went on to become Bishops. I ask for your prayers that such a fate might never befall your Rector.
