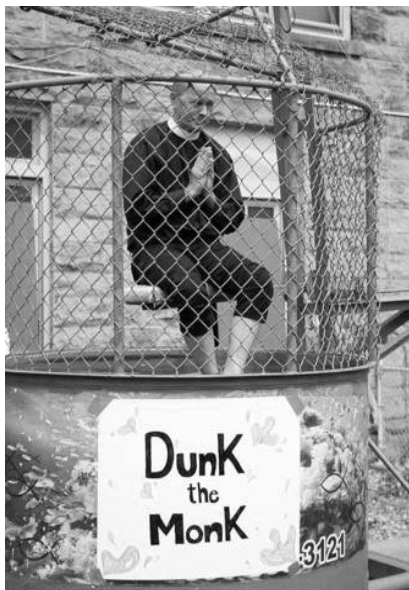
Summer 2019

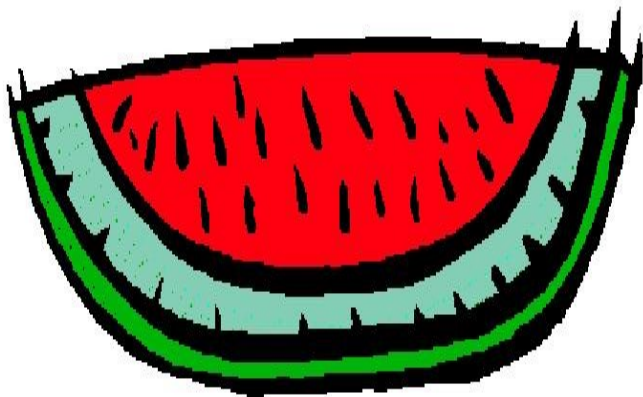

IMPACT Massillon 2019

As a community outreach project St. Tim's again participated in IMPACT Massillon. This is a project where churches and other service groups provide teams of volunteers that do outside home improvements to previously identified and selected properties in a designated neighborhood on an appointed day. IMPACT Massillon is led by Rev. Roger Alber and coordinated by Rev. Denny McDonald both of the First Baptist Church of Massillon. This year the designated neighborhood was a section of 13th St SE running south of Walnut St. The IMPACT Massillon designated day was Saturday June 1st. The St. Tim's 2019 team members included: Ann Higgins, Mike Burns, Kelly Gayheart, Jim Jobe, Henry Aegeter, Bonnie Burns, Shane Burns, Jeanne Glick, Mary Humbert, Stover Ingling, Larry Muschkat, Hayley Sunquist, Carrie Rice, Connie Keplinger and Sarah Emmert.

The residents were contacted, a walkthrough of the locations was made, resident requests were discussed, plans were formulated, and the supplies were purchased.

Work done previous to and in preparation for IMPACT Day included:

Friday May 24th – deconstruction of buckled sidewalk in front of large mature oak trees

Friday May 31st – Construction of the forms and expansion joints for 2 new sidewalk areas, tree trimming in back yard.

On IMPACT Massillon day, Saturday June 1st, 2019, the St. Tim's team started by meeting at the church at 7:30am to transport equipment and tools to the properties. On this day the crew was able to:

At 13th St SE property #1

Power wash the side entry deck and steps

Add additional treated lumber to stabilize the side steps

At 13th St property #2

Yard clean up included hedge and shrub trimming, further tree trimming, sidewalk edge trimming and weeding

Trenching of the new side parking area and spreading previously delivered gravel (*common materials – common materials are materials provided in large quantity by volunteer commercial companies at no expense to the individual team)

Cleaning of front and back roof gutters and placing gutter guard over cleaned out gutters

Delivery and pouring of fresh cement (common materials), level and smooth the surface of the 2 sections of new cement, texture the surface and edge the sides

At the end of the day (7:30am- 2:30pm) all work was completed except:

The following Sunday and Monday Larry and Mike returned to take down forms, fill in and seed along the new sidewalk.

The volunteer tree trimming company is to come later in June to do the big job of trimming the giant oak trees in front of the 1023 13th St property.

The volunteer cement contractor is to return to make the appropriate cuts for the new sidewalk. (If this does not happen, Mike thinks we could rent a cement saw and he and Larry could do that.)

Our lunch connection was Carrie Rice, Connie Keplinger and Sarah Emmert who brought the team and our property resident a delicious meal with sandwiches, pasta salad, chips, cookies and cold drinks.

In summary the St. Timothy's IMPACT Massillon 2019 team consisting of 15 volunteers worked 106 hours and used \$131.26 of our \$500 budget to spread Christian Love in our community.

RECTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

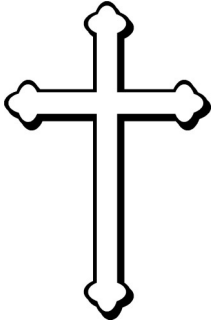

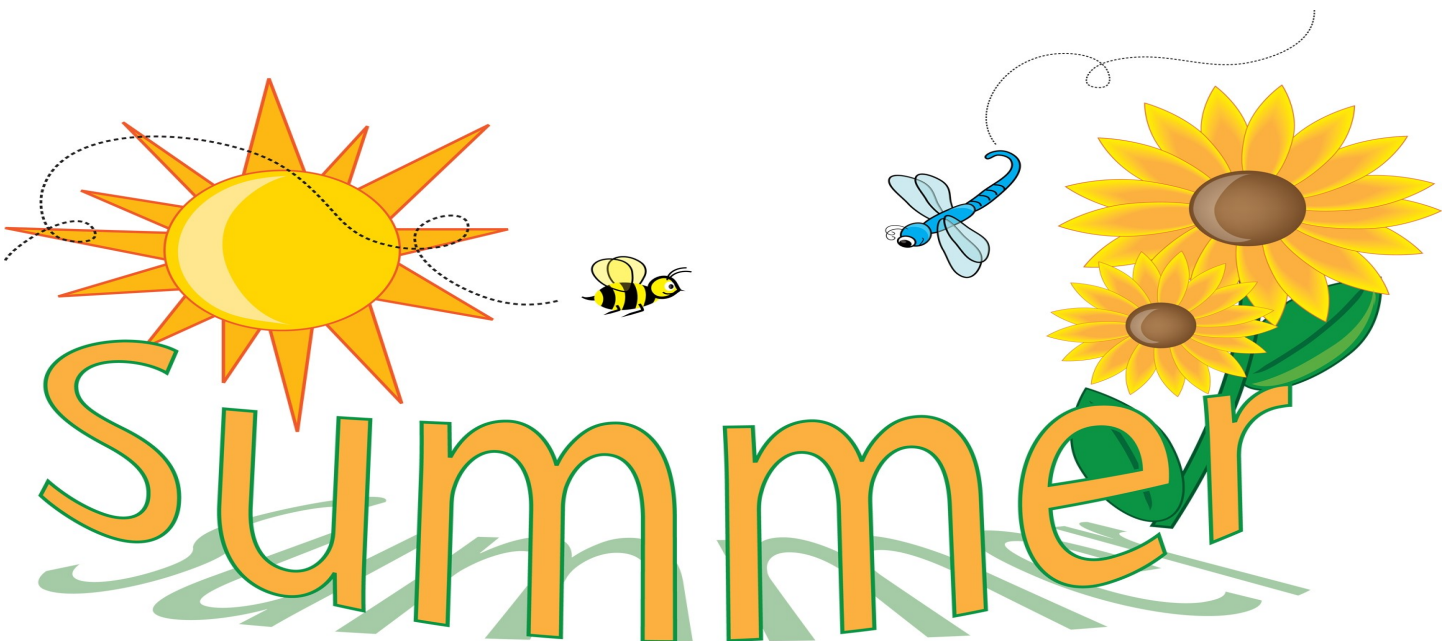
